Minutes of the Academic Council Meeting

The meeting of the academic Council (AC) was held on 25th October, 2018 at 11.30 am in the Autonomy cell of the institute.

The meeting was chaired by **Dr. R. K. Pandit**, Director of the Institute. **Er. Ramesh Agarwal**, Secretary, Scindia Engineering College Society (SECS) Gwalior, **Shri Prashant Mehta**, Member, Board of Governors (Nominee of Hon'ble Chairman BoG), **Dr. Mohan Sen**, Special Invitee from RGPV Bhopal and **Dr. Rajesh Bhargava**, Dy. Registrar (Acad.) RGPV Bhopal (Nominee of Hon'ble VC RGPV Bhopal) attended the meeting.

Out of the four members nominated by the Board of Governors, **Dr. Rommel Mehta**, **Professor School of Planning and Architecture (SPA)**, **New Delhi** attended the meeting while Dr. S.G. Deshmukh, Director, ABV-IIITM Gwalior, Dr. D.D. Agrawal, Professor, Jiwaji University, Gwalior and Dr. Dharmendra Kumar, Professor, Computer Science and Engineering, G.J. University Hisar, could not attend the meeting.

Dr. Sulochana Wadhwani, Professor, Electrical Engineering, Nodal Manager for Outcome Based Education (OBE) in the Institute & Deputy Controller Examination attended the meeting as a special invitee.

The following deliberations took place in the meeting. The Item wise details are as follows:

To confirm the minutes of the last Academic Council Meeting held on 26th April, Item: AC-1 2018:

> The minutes of the previous Academic Council meeting held on 26th April, 2018 were confirmed with a few modifications, after the following discussions. Discussion regarding flexible Scheme Structure (implemented w.e.f. July 2018

for 2017-18 & 2018-19 admitted batch)

- Dean, academics apprised that the flexible scheme structure has been implemented (for UG Programmes) with effect from July 2018 for the batches admitted in 2017-18 & 2018-19 sessions.
- Dr. Mohan Sen, Special Invitee from RGPV Bhopal informed that the ordinance relating to flexible scheme is under preparation and will be released / notified shortly by the RGPV Bhopal. Moreover, as decided earlier for the award of UG degree in Engineering/Technology (without Honours / Minor Specialization), it is required to earn 170 Credits. For the B. Architecture degree the total credit requirement is 260 credits.
- In continuation, it was also reiterated that additional Credit requirement for getting an Honours or Minor Specialization in other interdisciplinary areas / fields of Engineering, Technology, Applied Science, Management etc, is 20 additional Credits for Engineering & 24 Credits for B. Architecture.
- It was decided that necessary adjustments in the credits of 5th to 8th Semester will be done for 2017-18 admitted batch to align the total credit requirements (170 & 260 for B.Tech & B. Architecture respectively) with the 2018-19 admitted batch onwards. This will bring uniformity in total credit requirement for all the batches (2017-18 & 2018-19 admitted onwards) which are under the Flexible Curriculum.
- It is decided to write "Flexible Scheme" on the mark sheets issued to year 2017-18 admitted batch onwards.

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- In order to prepare "Minor Specialization tracks" prerequisites should be taken into consideration and same must be mentioned unambiguously against each course in the respective track.
- The syllabi of DE, List of OCs and their syllabi and Minor Specialization tracks will be placed before the House in the next meeting.

Item: AC-2

To approve academic regulations and guidelines for Credit transfer through SWAYAM/NPTEL using AICTE guidelines (Up to 20% of the total courses being offered in a particular program in a Semester) and to provide guidance for deciding the modalities of conduction of these courses

The House reiterated that additional credits for honours/minor specialization as well as credits for elective courses (DEs & OCs) can be acquired through SWAYAM/NPTEL/MOOC (Massive Open Online Courses) platform based learning in accordance with the guidelines issued by AICTE Gazette notification dated 17th August 2016 for conducting and evaluating courses through the MOOCs. Any amendments issued thereafter will also be followed in totality.

According to the Gazette "an Institution can only allow up to 20% of the total courses being offered in a particular program in a Semester through the online learning courses provided through SWAYAM platform".

On the basis of these guidelines it was resolved that up to 34 Credits out of total 170 for Engineering/Technology students & 52 credits out of total 260 credits for B. Architecture students can be earned through SWAYAM /NPTEL / MOOC platform based learning for the award of UG degree in Engineering/Technology & Architecture respectively (without Honours / Minor Specialization).

Moreover, to obtain "Honours or Minor Specialization", 20 Credits additionally can be completed through SWAYAM /NPTEL / MOOC platform based learning. In this manner, students aspiring for minor specialization or Honours during the tenure of B. Tech programme can opt for a total of 54 (34+20) Credits and the students of the B. Architecture programme can earn up to 72 (52+20)credits through SWAYAM /NPTEL / MOOC platform based learning.

In this regard the House noted that the guidelines regarding "credit transfer from MOOCs" by All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE) and the affiliating university, i.e RGPV Bhopal, as issued from time to time will be binding on the institute.

Furthermore, in connection with MOOC (SWAYAM/NPTEL) based

learning, following points were approved:

Gazette Notification, 'AICTE (Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM) Regulation, 2016 dated 17th August 2016, states that "The SWAYAM shall notify to the Registrars of all the Institutions, on 1st June and 1st November every year, the list of the online learning Courses going to be offered in the forthcoming Semester".

In this regards, the Institutions shall, within 4 weeks from the date of notification by SWAYAM, consider through their Board of Studies (BoS) the online learning courses being offered through the SWAYAM platform and keeping in view the academic requirements, decide upon the courses which it shall permit for credit transfer.

The list of courses which the students can opt from the MOOCs platform will be displayed on the website well in advance, so that students can select the courses of their choice.

- The Academic Council may allow online courses of SWAYAM if
 - There is non-availability of suitable teaching staff for running a course in (i) the Institution or
 - The facilities for offering the elective papers (courses), sought for by the (ii) students are not on offer in the Institution, but are available on the SWAYAM platform or if
 - The courses offered on SWAYAM would supplement the teaching-learning (iii) process in the Institution.
- The Courses may be run/offered from MOOC (SWAYAM/NPTEL) based platform according to the above guidelines. Each such Course must be of minimum 2 credits.
- Board of Studies (BoS) should prepare the list of Departmental Elective (DE) Courses which are to be run under MOOC (SWAYAM/NPTEL) based learning and the same will be made public in advance.
- It is also decided to establish registration procedure at departmental level (e) for Elective Courses.
- The department must designate a course coordinator/facilitator to (f) guide the students throughout the course and also facilitate/conduct the Lab/Practical sessions/examinations as required. Provision of class room interaction will also be made for Elective Courses which will be offered under MOOC (SWAYAM/NPTEL) based learning.
- For the courses opted under MOOC, the equivalent credit weightage will be given to the students, for the credits earned in online learning courses through SWAYAM/NPTEL platform and other similar platforms, in the credit plan of the program w.e.f. 2017-18 admitted batch onwards.

(h) However, for matching the credit requirement curricular/scheme requirements, more than one MOOC course can also be selected against an Elective Course, provided that the collective credits are equal to or more than the credit requirement. Also, each such selected course must be of minimum 2 credits. The Institute will also make necessary efforts to develop 3-4 MOOC (i) courses of its own. Item: AC-3 Conduction of examination of ex-students on equivalency basis The House appreciated and approved this proposal and resolved that the examination of ex-students will be conducted on the basis of equivalency w.e.f April-May 2019 examination with the courses of current schemes, as recommended by the respective Board of Studies (BoS). The House instructed that there should be an "Consent Clause" in the examination form where the students will be required to check mark a box to give their consent for appearing in current courses on the basis of equivalency. Item: AC-4 To review and decide the time-line/schedule for conduction of M.E./M.Tech. fourth semester examinations M.E./M.Tech. Students submit their dissertation throughout the year and expect the early conduction of examinations and declaration of result. It is difficult to send a person frequently to Bhopal for the declaration of result. > Therefore in the interest of the students and to maintain regularity it is proposed to permit the students to submit the dissertation only twice a year as per the following details: Date/Time of Dissertation Last date for Examination **Result Declaration** Submission 15th May May/June First week of July (This will help the students to apply for jobs etc.) 15th December December First week of January The House approved this proposal. To consider digital submission(on CD) of B.E/M.E./M.Tech./dissertation and Item: AC-5 only M.E./M.Tech examination conduction of Skype/video conferencing/Google Duo or similar facility > It is proposed that only soft copy (A single pdf file with scanned copy of candidate declaration etc) submission to be initiated and the same will be uploaded on MOODLE after the result declaration.

> It is also proposed that in the dissertation a one page abstract should be written in Hindi. Examination on Skype is expected to save money and time both. The panel of internal examiners will be nominated to certify the authenticity of marks as decided in consultation

with the external examiner on Skype after the presentation by student.

The House approved the proposal; however, in place of skype, other platforms approved for educational purposes must be used. The following points were finalized after discussion. (a) It is decided to allow the submission of project reports / dissertation in soft copy (pdf file with scanned copy of candidate declaration and other required certificates). (b) It is further decided that the password protected copy of submitted record (project report/ dissertation) will be preserved in the institute for minimum 10 years duration. (c) M.E. /M.Tech/MUP examination / dissertation viva voce may be conducted using the platforms which are already in use by Higher Education Department / MHRD such as A-View (under NMEICT project) / other similar platforms. However, for the non examination matters other platforms such as skype can be used. (d) It is also decided to make the partial detail (title, abstract, keywords) public on the institute website. (e) An abstract in Hindi, consisting of about 250 words will be written at the Item: AC-6 To review the Pattern of question paper and consider revision in pattern if necessary Present pattern: All five questions (Set for each unit of syllabus) are compulsory. In each question there are two questions of 2 marks, one of 3 marks and one of 7 marks to be attempted out of two questions. (Two 7 marks questions are asked and any one is to be attempted out of two questions) The House resolved that a workshop must be conducted at a suitable date where each department will propose a "template of question paper pattern" and the most suitable template can be finalized. The matter is deferred till the next meeting. Item: AC-7 To consider the provision of asking a certain percentage of questions from the meticulously prepared extensive Question Bank uploaded on MOODLE in the end term question paper [The practice, if approved, may prove quite effective. The students will be required to study & prepare a large number of questions from the Question Bank, in a

database. Till then the matter will be kept on hold.

- 4. Analysis of question papers for Academic Year 2017-18
- 5. CO attainments for all courses beginning with the Academic Year (2014-15
- 6. To Identify gaps in CO attainment levels (wherever applicable) for Year 2017-18 and propose corrective measures for improvement
- 7. To set attainment targets for all COs for courses being offered in the Academic Year 2018-19
- 8. To propose "Equivalence of Subjects" for all courses running in the various schemes
- 9. Syllabi and scheme starting from 2014-18 batch onwards

Proposals with regard to Course Outcomes (COs), Departmental Electives (DEs) and Open Category (OC) Courses have been examined and it was decided to conduct an Internal workshop for finalization of the lists of OCs and to frame guidelines for their conduction. The same will be finalized in the next Academic Council meeting.

The HoDs also presented the list of modules developed under "Value Added Courses".

The House approved the minutes of the above listed BoS.

Item: AC-13

Any other matter with the permission of the Chair

- It is decided to make the provision of Summer Internship Programme in even and odd semesters so that students who have not attained minimum qualifier can be given an additional chance to fulfil this essential requirement for the degree.
- It was suggested by the Dean Academics that the 8th Semester course name "Innovative Technical Contribution" should be changed to "Professional Development" in order to bring all kinds of personality and skill development activities of the students into the orbit and to encourage student participation in professional chapter activities, club activities, cultural events, sports, personality development activities also, in addition to technical events.

It was decided that clear and unambiguous assessment norms for this internal assessment course will be developed and placed before the House for approval in the next meeting.

- It is decided to invite suggestions for the improvement of "Flexible Scheme" by making it public on the institute website.
- Courses falling under the Mandatory Course (MC) category (viz. Induction programme, Biology for Engineers & Indian Constitution & Traditional Knowledge) will be non-credit courses and the end semester examination will be optional for these courses; However, an additional mark sheet will be issued to such qualifying students who opted for the same.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair.
