STUDENTS CLUBS



Introduction

Students' clubs were first launched in the institute during the academic *session 2017-18* with the objective of providing an opportunity to the students to take part in activities other than academics which channelizes the energy of youth in positive direction and results in learning by fun. It also provides an opportunity for interaction with outer world. Initially **50 clubs** were formed.

Modus-Operandi

The student committee of each club organizes the activities which are monitored by the Faculty Coordinator. Prior permission for each activity is obtained by the club from **Dean Student Welfare office**.

The activities are organized either on weekend or in evening hours on week days. Indoor activities are organized in Seminar Halls, Class Rooms, Conclave Center, etc. All the activities are conducted on self-sustainable basis by the clubs.

Level of Activities

The activities organized are either at College Level, Inter-Collegiate, State or National Level.

Recognition

Winners and Runner-ups of the competition organized are awarded with cash prizes and certificates. Participates and Volunteers are also given certificates. Due weightage is given to the students during assessment for **'Professional Development'** in UG Final Year, which has a provision of 2 credits with effect **from 2020-21** admitted batch.

Report

Each club submits the report of activities organized in the prescribed format at the end of each semester, which is compiled by **DSW office**. The report is published on the institute website.

Evaluation of Club Performance

Institute has started the practice of giving annual awards every year on the occasion of **MITS Day (10th March)** to the **best 5 clubs** based on their performance i.e., from academic session **2019-20**. The performance of each club is determined by **Student Development Cell** based on a mathematical model which consists of no. of parameters.

Formation of New Club

‘Student Development Cell’ (SDC) considers the application from students for formation of **new clubs**. SDC also look into the re-organization of clubs and appointment of **Faculty Coordinator**.
